

#### Great Things Are Happening at the Growve Zone!

Summer is a unique time of year for the children at many churches. During the summer, Union Grove sponsors a summer camp for kids. During the month long camp, children learn about their religion while doing many different activities. The camps combine faith education with themes that interest children such as games and crafts. Games can strengthen bonds between campers, and camp crafts can provide lessons that help campers memorize Bible verses.

As a retired teacher, I know that the students forget some of the skills previously taught. I also know the importance of helping the students retain the knowledge previously learned. Mrs. Hill, an educator in the Houston County School District made sure this didn't happen to the campers. I questioned Kierra Williams, a second grader at Parkwood Elementary about what she thought about the camp. She told me she liked coming to the camp and will be coming again next year. She told me she enjoyed taking the field trips to the skating rink, Stevie B's, Rigby's as well as the Museum of Arts and Science. The culminating activity was the Grove Zone Summer Camp Showcase:

The goal of most camps is that every child will have a fun, entertaining summer experience while being introduced to a variety of new activities, challenges and friends. I believe that goal was met at the Grove Zone.































**Summer Camp 2014** was a success and approximately 42 youth in grades 1 - 8 were served. The camp staff consisted of 12 counselors and the Golden Achievers served breakfast and lunch each day.

Sign Language was added to the regular components of the arts. The students presented a song at the showcase using sign language taught by Ms. Hill. Leo Finkley, Jr. and Kymori Edwards dazzled the youth each day with a new theme that included exciting Science experiments. Field Trip Fridays was also a highlight of the camp.

#### 7 Keys to Effective Ministry Meetings

Have you ever had your time, energy, and spiritual gifts seemingly wasted with ineffective ministry meetings? Here are seven keys to keep that from happening and make your ministry meetings the bomb.com!

#### 1. Use the meetings as building blocks for the vision of the ministry.

My desire is that every gathering works toward manifesting the vision for Union Grove. Every meeting, rehearsal, worship experience, Bible study, etc. is to work as a building block to make the vision come to fruition. Use your meetings to make the vision for your respective ministry a reality by sharing teachings or facilitating discussions on required reading. This helps everyone on your ministry team to keep growing and become and accomplish what the Lord has ordained.

#### 2. Use the meetings to develop trust.

Allow for questions and candid discussions on sensitive issues. Be honest in the answers you provide. Don't give people the run around! Admit whenever you drop the ball and apologize when necessary. Demonstrate you care about what's on people's minds especially when there are concerns pertaining to money. Trust is one of your most powerful tools in your leadership toolkit.

#### 3. Use different things to lighten the mood.

We've used music, skits, and humor to lighten the mood and dissipate the tension that once dominated the atmosphere in our congregational meetings. Lighten the mood of your meetings so people can relax and gel with one another. This helps make ministry teams effective and creative as they work well together and serves as a great recruiting tool, too.

#### 4. Make meetings very informative.

Providing updates, reports, teaching and vision casting all serve to make ministry meetings very informative and productive. Stay away from gossip, complaining, and chatter that simply wastes time and does not glorify God.

#### 5. Start and end on time

Starting and ending meetings on time is one of the greatest tools to use to keep people coming to the meetings.

#### 6. Implement different control measures to keep things orderly.

People need to be free to talk and express themselves, but with love, discipline, and respect. Disagreements happen, but let's watch what we say and how we behave. There are plenty Scriptures that speak of self-control, watching our mouths, and how to resolve conflicts with one another. It is up to the leader to implement control measures or boundaries that allows for everything to be done decently and in order. This does not mean that adults are to be treated like children. Amen! Boundaries are necessary in all aspects of society in order for all of us to live at peace with one another.

#### 7. Deliver dynamic presentations.

Presentations delivered in meetings can make or break a team. I've seen ideas shot down not because they were bad ideas, but great ideas poorly presented. Hone your presentation skills by paying attention to the questions your team tend to ask and do the best you can to anticipate the questions they might ask as your prepare your presentation. Answer those questions in your presentation and it can invite the support you may need from your team as you move forward in the Lord's work. Deliver your presentation with passion, humility, humor, and God's Word and it can make the meeting one that people are glad they did not miss.

**Conclusion:** Church meetings have helped our church transform over time. I pray your ministry meetings will continually move your ministry and our church forward into God's ordained destiny. Enjoy the journey!

STEP 6 – (PRAY) – Eliminating Waste from our Budget!

The Daily Bread a few days ago used the scripture Isaiah 55:1-2, Come all who are thirsty, come to the waters and you who have no money, come buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost. Why spend money on what is not bread and your labor on what does not satisfy?

This scripture tells us about God's free gift of love. As I read it, my mind also thought about all the things we spend our money on that provide no satisfaction.

Thus, our topic for this month, "Eliminating Waste from Our Budget". Let's go back to one of the basic things we started at the beginning, keeping a record of our daily expenditures for a month. If you still have this information, take a look at it. If you don't, you can still do this. Start today writing down everything you spend each day. Start with the information in your checkbook and add other daily expenses. This includes that cup of coffee and that pack of gum. Those cash items we seem to lose track of. Just keep a little notebook in your pocket or purse.

Once we have compiled the information, we are ready to review. This list will reveal a lot about us. Are you an impulse buyer like me? You see it, you buy it. Some telemarketer calls and catches you in a good mood and you buy or donate without thinking? Do you have things in your closet you have never worn?

Do you grocery shop on an empty stomach? I know, it is easier to stop by on your way home, but it does cost you extra money. As you unpack your groceries, note all the items you bought that you normally wouldn't have if you weren't hungry or tired. Do you use a list when you go to the grocery store? I have found it more efficient to keep a running list on my counter. Whenever anything is getting low, I add it to the list. When I get ready to go, I just tear off the sheet and I'm on my way. Even more efficient is keeping the list on your phone. That way when you stop by unexpectedly, you don't have to call home and get someone to read you the list. Whether paper or digital, grocery lists save money.

Check yourself and your family, you may be able to eliminate enough waste to help you pay off another bill. I know someone who stopped buying soda/tea when eating out. This saved his family enough money to finance their annual vacation. As you eat out, check out the price of tea and soda. This can sometimes add \$5.00 to \$10.00 to your bill.




So why should you attend P.L.A.C.E? Simple – because it may reveal more about who God made you to be so that you can use your gifts to further His Kingdom.

#### Grilled Summer Sizzling Shrimp Kabobs

#### **Ingredients:**

1 lb. of large shrimp
1 medium bell pepper
8-10 small cherry tomatoes
4 small corn on the cobs
garlic to season
old bay to season
4 wooden or metal skewers
½ cup of virgin olive oil
BBQ grill

Season your shrimp with garlic and old bay; toss them in a bowl with a 1/4 of olive oil, set aside, cut bell pepper into cube like pieces, cut each corn into half so that you will have 8 ears...add a shrimp to skewer then a tomato, then a pepper, then a corn. Continue this with at least 3 shrimp to a skewer. If you can do 4 that's great. Make sure your grill is nice and hot. Place shrimp on grill and brush lightly with olive oil, let cook 4 mins on each side brushing the other side when you turn them. After they are done serve them now or later, they will still be delicious...can be served with a delicious salad or over rice!
