

The Stone is Rolled Away - Christ is Risen

But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said."

Matthew 28:1-9, Mark 16:1-8 Luke 24:1-12, John 20:1-10



On Sunday morning, two days after the death and burial of Jesus, some women went very early, as soon as it was light, to the tomb in the garden. One of these women was Mary Magdalene, another was also named Mary, and another was named Salome. They were bringing some more fragrant gums and spices to place in the wrappings upon the body of Jesus. And as they went they said to each other, "Who will roll away for us the great stone at the door of the cave?"

But when they came to the cave, they saw that the seal was broken, the stone was rolled away, and the soldiers who had been on guard were gone. There stood the tomb of Jesus all open! They did not know that before they came to the tomb there had been an earthquake; and that an angel had come down from heaven and rolled away the stone, and sat upon it.

When the soldiers on guard saw the angel, with his flashing face, and his dazzling garments, they fell to the ground as though they were dead, and as soon as they could rise up, they fled away from the spot in terror; so when the women came there was no man in sight. As soon as Mary Magdalene saw that the tomb was open, without stopping to look into it, she ran quickly to tell the disciples. A moment after she had gone, the other women looked into the tomb, and they saw that the body of Jesus was not there.

But they saw sitting at each end of the tomb a young man, clothed in a long white garment. Their faces shone like angels, and when the women saw them they were filled with fear. One of the angels said to them: "Do not be afraid; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is not here; he is risen, as he said that he would rise from the dead. Come; see the place where the Lord lay; and then go and tell his disciples, and tell Peter too, that Jesus will go before you into Galilee, and you shall see him there".

Then the women went away in mingled joy and fear. They ran in haste to bring this word of the angel to the disciples.

WHO ARE WE?

For the majority of my life, I've always thought that I had no value, no one that really loved me. I had body issues, social issues, you name it, and I probably thought it was me. I tried to do everything that I could think of (worldly) to fit in with friends and family. If I said "yes" to everything asked of me, maybe they would like me. Oh, how wrong I was; it just made it easier to use me.

I had attended church all my life, but I never knew Jesus. After I started attending Union Grove, I started going to Bible Study, Sunday School; getting involved with ministry. I thought what could it hurt; this was my last chance to change my life. This went on for a while until something happened inside. I finally knew that God loved me; no matter what I had done, no matter what I thought about myself, He loved me. My heart began to change, I loved myself. I allowed other people in, not fearing rejection or being used because Jesus loved me.

You may be asking yourself, "what does this have to do with me?" I realized that we are no different. We all go through things, we all have negative thoughts about ourselves and I'm here to tell you that only through a relationship with Jesus, your heart can also change. We were all placed here, Union Grove, to help each other. FOOD DRIVE


Jr SWAT has launched their first Community Service event for 2014.





LET'S GET OUR FINANCIAL HOUSE IN ORDER PART III



Before we move to STEP 3 in getting our house in order, let me ask a question. Did you get a tax refund this year or are you expecting to get one? What are/did you do with your tax refund? Some people get large refunds and within two weeks can't figure out what happened to the money. A few suggestions if you haven't already disposed of it: (1) Pay off debt. (2) Start your emergency fund. (3) Start your vacation fund. (4) Start/contribute to your retirement account. (5) Start/contribute to your children's/grandchildren's education fund. Too many of us allowed Uncle Sam to use our hard earned money all year interest free. The average refund is \$3,120. This amount divided by 12, yields \$260.00

per month. What could you do with an extra \$260.00 each month? Take action

(Great Things are Happening)

right away to change your withholding so that you get more of your money in your check. Remember, it is better to owe a little or break even than to let the government use a large chunk of your income for free.

STEP 3 – (PRAY) If I didn't mention this before, pray before each step.- CLEANING UP YOUR CREDIT!!!!!!! - NOTE: There is no such thing as cleaning up your credit report. Do not pay someone to do this. The only way to "clean up" your credit is to pay your bills on time.

What did you learn from your credit report? Is all well? If there were accounts you didn't recognize, dispute them. Strange accounts may be the result of financial fraud, or something you just forgot. If there were no surprises, are there any outstanding small balances you can simply pay out from your next paycheck or two? To dispute an entry on your report, just send written notice to the credit reporting agency. Instructions are included in your report. Your creditors will have 30-45 days to answer. During this period, the information will be removed from your records. Once your creditor sends in a response and can substantiate the amounts, they will be reapplied to your credit file. If your creditor cannot verify the charges, they are permanently removed from your credit history. I listed a few ways to increase your credit score last month. Let's break down a few of those:

- a. Pay off and close out store credit cards. Even if your store card is a major chain store, the interest rates are usually high, and this type of credit is considered to be bad debt. A simple solution would be to roll this amount over to your major credit card. DO NOT CLOSE OUT MAJOR CREDIT CARDS UNLESS YOU HAVE DUPLICATES, i.e. two Visas, two Master Cards.
- b. Don't deal with finance companies. Again, this type of account is considered bad debt as far as your credit score is concerned regardless of whether you make payments on time. The interest rates will be high and they take forever to pay down.

The PSA Test

The PSA Test: Prostate-specific antigen, or PSA, is a protein produced by cells of the prostate gland. The PSA test measures the level of PSA in a man's blood. If the test is high, it is one of the tests used to determine if a man may have prostate cancer. However, studies from the National Cancer Institute in 2012 have also shown that prostate cancer could also develop with a low PSA level. The test may also be used to monitor men who have had prostate cancer in the past.

There are other reasons that a man could have a high PSA level, some of these include an enlarged prostate (sometimes-called BPH), or an inflammation of the prostate (sometimes called prostatitis).

When is the best time to have a PSA? Some studies suggest screening at age 50, while other studies recommend earlier screening depending on your family history. The best advice for you is to have this conversation with your doctor. You and your doctor can take into account your medical and family history and determine what is best for you.

Have you had that conversation with your doctor? If not, this is a good day to pick up the phone and make an appointment.





Shrimp Linguine


Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 30 minutes Serves 4 - 6 people
