May we continue to pray, not only walking; driving, running, flying, etc.

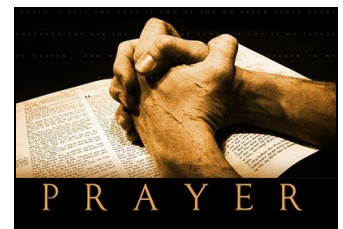

Saturday, October 12, 2013

We entered the Vision Center as individuals, couples and in groups. There was Sister Jan Scott at the welcome table to greet us. The Center had been beautifully decorated by the Program Committee.

I was introduced by Sister Annie Abrams to Sister Jeanette H. Cabbage, a former Golden Achiever, who currently lives in Macon. Sister Cabbage suggested the ministry name, Golden Achievers, in 2007.

At 2 p.m., the Fraziers - Brother Leroy and Sister Shirley - stepped to the microphone as our moderators for the afternoon. After Assistant Pastor John Dukes gave the opening prayer, the welcome provided by the moderators, and the magnificent hymn led by Minister Meriam R. Newsome, Macedonia Baptist Church, Panama City, Florida, there were some tantalizing biblical tidbits presented by the Fraziers... with the audience trying to participate...taking all of us by storm...with no answers...but, laughter everywhere. I couldn't remember any of their biblical tidbits, so I'll try a few of my own.

- **What state is mentioned in the book of Ezekiel 20: 29?** Then, I said to them: What is this high place you go to? It is called Bamah to this day.
- **What car did the disciples have to share?** Philippians 2:2. Make full my joy, that ye be of the same mind, having the same love, being of one accord...
- **They all met at a former famous hotel in Washington, DC. Nehemiah 8:1** ...all the people assembled as one man in the square before the Water Gate.
- **What is the cereal mentioned in the bible? Exodus 16:14.** When the dew was gone, thin flakes like frost on the ground appeared on the desert floor. (And, we are told elsewhere they were honey flavored. Frosted Flakes were the first cereal! They'rre Greeaatt!)

The honorees, having reached that golden age of 80, were presented by Sister Mary Forte.

1. **Sister Zenobia Gude**, who taught school for thirty-three years, is from Crisp County, Cordele, Georgia. She joined Union Grove in 1955.
2. **Deacon Edward J. Jarvis** came to Union Grove in May 1977 and has been ordained as a deacon since December 14, 1980.
3. **Sister Martha B. Medlock** arrived in the mid 70's. She has served in many ministries at the church, and currently serves on the calling committee of the Golden Achievers ministry.

We enjoyed the scrumptious meal of chicken, green beans, rice, tea and/or lemonade, and a variety of desserts.

Our Pastor, David A. Clarke, Sr. made remarks and demonstrated how we should enter church services tomorrow, with a brief shuffle. The Benediction concluded a delightful afternoon.





Early Morning Services: Sunday, October 13, 2013.

When I arrived Sunday morning at around 8:15 a.m., to the balcony I went. Pastor Clarke was preaching from Matthew 5:1-2. His topic was, *“And He Opened His Mouth and Taught Them.”* The “them” were the disciples being taught by Jesus to be like Him not only with words, but with deeds. They, the disciples, with all kinds of backgrounds and faults, dropped everything to go with Jesus...to sit at his feet to learn. The pastor mentioned, “There is more to a person than ‘just a person’.”

- The question was asked: “What defines a person”? We are the fruits of the spirit...love; joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. “I like you am more than I have ever been.”
- “What really matters”? What really matters is what’s in the Beatitudes, Matthew 5:3-12... poor in spirit, who mourn, the meek, who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, pure in heart, the peacemakers, and who endure persecution and who falsely accuse you for My sake.
- Pastor Clarke asked several questions. *“Have you been to relationship school? Have you paused to ask, what is your potential?”* Pastor Clarke emphasized, *“Do you know what really matters to God?”*
- We must avail ourselves of His teachings!! Follow the examples of the disciples.
- How do we know? Jesus taught me to trust Him...wait on Him...and again, avail ourselves of His teachings.

Sunday School: *A Promise to Sarah*, Genesis 17: 15-17; 18:9-15; 21:1-7, taught by Brother Michael White. A brief synopsis:

By the time Sarai reached her mid-70’s, she concluded she would never have a child and encouraged Abram to use her servant, Hagar, as a surrogate mother - an accepted practice of that day. Hagar gave birth to Ishmael. When Sarai was 90 and her husband was 99, the Lord promised them that within a year they would have a son. It was then that God marked the pledge by giving Abram the name Abraham and Sarai the name Sarah.

A short time later, heavenly messengers on their way to investigate Sodom and Gomorrah repeated the promise to Abraham. When Sarah overheard it, she “laughed to herself” (Genesis 18:12). But her laughter of disbelief became the laughter of astonishment and delight when at the age of 91 she gave birth to a son, Isaac.

Neither time nor natural laws can keep God from accomplishing His plans, Gen 17: 15-17; Nothing is too hard for the Creator and Sustainer of the entire universe, Genesis 18:13-15; and, Because God is faithful, He can and will do what He promises, Genesis 21:1-3.

“A Devine Call to Honor the Elders”

Leviticus 19:32

We entered the sanctuary to the music of “We’ve Come This Far By Faith”, dressed in Golden Achievers attire, marching unostentatiously and singing with the choir and congregation to our seats. The Deacons came forth with the devotion. Our Chaplain, Deacon Louis Laney also participated while seated at the Deacon’s post, in leading an old hymn. We all joined in singing from the top of our vocal cords with adoration to God. The Deacons, many of them Golden Achievers, continued to uplift the congregation with another song, scripture and prayer.

The uplifting and stupendous welcome was given by First Lady Michelle Clarke.

The scripture, “*Trust in the Lord and do Good*” from Psalm 37 was given by our eloquent, Pastor, David A. Clarke, Sr.

The moving Memorial Hymn/Candle Lighting was done by Brother and Sister Jerome Butler.

The Flags of Praise, taken from scripture, Psalm 51, was presented by the leader, Deaconess Pamela Myrick. A quiet peace enveloped the sanctuary. The music began to play. Dressed in white paints and tops, with a kind of blue cloak over their shoulders, it happened. The sisters began to come forth, moving in a kind of succinct movement with the music. First, there was Deaconess Catherine Jarvis coming from the left side, with movement of twists and turns, and arms moving to and fro. Deaconess Dorothy Jackson came from the right side with a different kind of twist, turns and movements. Lo and behold, coming up the center aisle, there was Sister Marie Anderson, moving back and forth to the music, with arms pointing to the heavens, while heading to the front of the sanctuary. When we thought the flags of praise was about to end, there came another, twisting and turning to the music. It was Sister Gwendolyn Reeves. What a demonstration of praise, with Sister Myrick cheering them on as if she was with them with every turn, dip, and/or swirl! We could only just stand and clap, clap, clap!!! Thanks, Vessels of Honor. You surely brought God’s house down, where it appears we were truly lifted up.

The choir sang and sang and sang. What music, what feeling, what an expression of faith, what joy! The Ministry of Music Director, Brother David, took to the microphone and sang *“Walk With Me”* and *“Down Through the Years.”* He sang and sang, with the entire congregation standing (except for those who could not stand moving their feet about), singing, smiling, dancing and clapping. There was joy everywhere.

There was more. Minister Meriam R. Newsome introduced the uniqueness of a man of God, Dr. Rufus Woods. The church got quiet again.

Then, Sister Kim Martin of New Hope, sang *“Take Me To the King”* and *“Walk Around Heaven”*, another appropriate song; we were over-joyed with happiness and praise. She, with a special melodic voice and delivery, got the congregation back to their feet again.

Having worked up a sweat of joy and adoration, the armor bearer helped Dr. Rufus Woods to the podium in the pulpit. Before getting started with the sermon, he ‘broke-out’ in a song, *“Faith”*. Dr. Woods sang and sang and we sang with him.

The topic of the sermon was *“A Devine Call to Honor the Elderly”*, with the scripture verse of Leviticus 19:32. *“You shall rise before the gray headed and honor the presence of an old man, and fear you God: I am the Lord.”*

He stated, *“To honor our elderly is a moral barometer. In the Bible, longevity is considered to be a reward.”*

Respect for older adults is emphasized in Leviticus 19 and other Bible passages. Sixty was generally the point at which a person was thought to enter old age (27:1-8). Older men served together as community elders. In the ideal vision of community life, the elders had great responsibility for maintaining the community’s commitment to God. It was assumed that experience had given them wisdom, and the story of Rehoboam’s refusal to listen to the older men’s advice drives home the point that it is perilous to ignore an older person’s advice (1 Kings 12:6-20). A similar attitude is reflected in the New Testament (1 Tim. 5:1-2). Paul points out another advantage of choosing older people for spiritual leadership. The community has had a chance to observe the older person for years, and his or her character is well known (vv. 9-11). It is also mentioned in 1 Timothy 5:3 that children and grandchildren *“honor your parents”* by meeting their needs in old age when they are truly destitute. Paul calls this *“putting your religion into practice.”* (vv. 8).

He reminded us, as stated in Exodus 20:12, *“Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the Lord your God is giving you.”*

Before ending the sermon, he mentioned the importance of inter-generational fellowship. There are several generational gaps. We need each other. If you ever think you do not need something from others, just remember we are all interdependent. Here, he pointed out, if you would just look at the many products we use everyday come from another country.

We can’t make it by ourselves. We need each other. We need the young. We need the elderly. Whether old or young, each plays an important role in life.

There was standing and clapping for the message.

G3 Minister Antonia Simmons had the little ones to give each Golden Achiever a card of thanks, made by their little artistic hands with symbols of love and delight. Thanks and more thanks for this precious symbol of love for the elderly.

During the Invitation to Discipleship, several individuals came forth to join Union Grove.



After the Video Announcements by the Media Ministry and giving our tithes and offerings, we departed the sanctuary for the rear of the church for cake to celebrate the birthday of a Golden Achiever.

Thanks to the Golden Achievers, and its leadership team of Sister Lena Nixon, Assistant Ministry Leader; Minister Dannie Dukes, Secretary; Deacon Louis Laney, Chaplain; Sisters Thornton, Bynum, and Mathis, Program Committee; Sister Marion Mathis, Decorating Committee; Sisters Martha Medlock, Helen Lloyd, Annie Abrams, and Alice Thornton, Calling Committee; and our Spiritual Enrichment Ministry, Vision Leader, Brother Leroy Frazier.

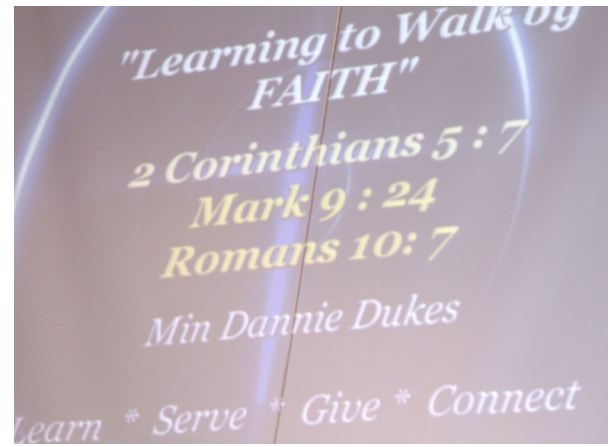

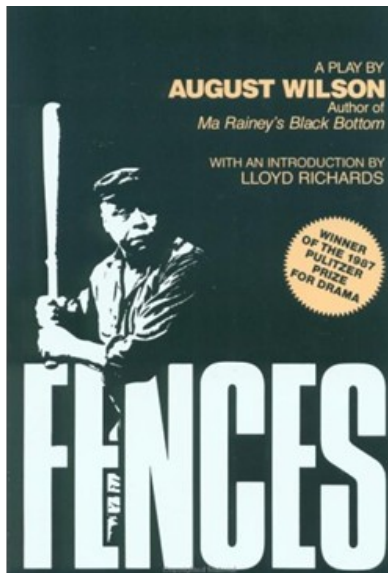

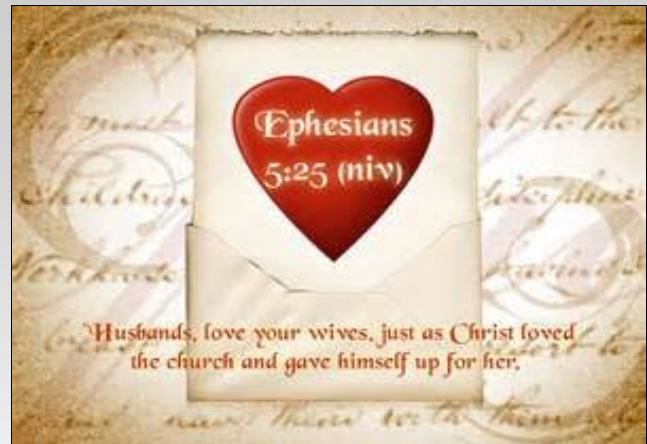

Jerk Turkey Rub for Thanksgiving

This mild jerk seasoning adds a fantastic flavor to turkey whether you are going to grill, smoke, or deep fry it. Remember when applying a rub to poultry you have to get it under the skin. The skin blocks flavor and won't let the rub penetrate.

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Preparation: Combine all ingredients and store in an airtight container.

Total Time: 10 minutes

Yield: Makes about 1 1/4 cups

Ingredients:

1 cup brown sugar

1/3 cup white sugar

1/4 cup salt

2 teaspoons garlic powder

2 teaspoons onion powder

1 teaspoon white pepper

1 teaspoon black pepper

1 teaspoon powdered smoke flavoring (optional)

Apply the rub to your turkey evenly covering under the skin as well as you can.

I let mine marinate for at least 12 hours, the minimum amount of time is 4 hours

Let cook for 2-3 hours depending on the size of your bird :)

Serve with your family traditional sides and enjoy!!!
