## ~ Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church History ~

In 1887, God inspired a group of God-fearing, Bible-believing Christians to gather under the shady branches of a bush harbor tree (located on a tract of land adjacent to Highway 247, approximately one block north of Green Street) to praise and worship, thus establishing the Union Grove Baptist Church. These spirit-filled members gathered to give thanks and to praise God for their many blessings. This assembly sparked the onset of Union Grove as a place of worship in a small farming town called Wellston, now known as Warner Robins, GA. As the membership grew, the space under the bush harbor was inadequate to meet the needs of the congregation. To accommodate this need, in 1887, R.W. and J.W. Johnson granted land to Union Grove for public worship. A mediumframed building was constructed on this land and it was during this period that Union Grove became a well



established church in this small farming community.

The church was physically relocated from across Highway 247 by the late Deacon Marvin Colbert with the assistance of others, using a mule and wagon when Robins Air Force (which Base was under construction) saw a need for this tract of land in 1940. Several church members searched for a new site and purchased land at the present location of the church, 809 Davis South Drive. from Sherman Reid for \$50.00.


The ground breaking ceremony for the renovation of the church and construction of the current sanctuary was held on August 13.1994. The dedication service was held on October 15, 1995. Over 126 years, the membership has grown from a few gathered under the bush harbor to 650 members as of July, 2013.

On December 15, 2002, Pastor David Anthony Clarke, Sr. was installed as the nineteenth pastor of Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church.



- **Pastor David Anthony Clarke, Sr.** was elected Pastor of UGMBC on October 12, 2002. He was installed as its 19th Pastor on December 15, 2002.

### ~ Remembering Deacon Johnnie Head, Sr.



1912 - 1998

Deacon Johnnie Head, Sr. was born on April 9, 1912 in Monroe County to Harrison and Addie Smith Head. He was married to Lois Head and they had seventeen children. He received his early childhood education in Monroe County and later moved to Houston County.

In 1935, Johnnie Head, Sr. was ordained as a deacon at Oak Grove Baptist Church and in 1940, he came to Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church to fulfill the calling that God had on his life. Deacon Head was blessed with a unique voice that blessed those who heard him. He became well known in the Middle Georgia Community as "the Singing Ethiopian."

In the 1970's, Deacon Head participated in the renovation of the UGMBC to include:

- 1. Several classrooms
- 2. Pastor's study
- 3. Fully equipped kitchen
- 4. Conference room
- 5. Two restrooms
- 6. Choir room
- 7. Administrative offices
- 8. Bricking of the newly annexed building

Additionally, he served as Chairman of the UGMBC Building Committee, Sunday School Teacher, Bible School Teacher, Sunday School Superintendent and Chairman of the Deacon Board.

## **Mission: Honduras 2013**

I first heard about Orphanage Emmanuel about two years ago. I was told it was the most beautiful place full of smiling faces both young and old along with hearts that love the Lord. My friend, retired Maj. Wayne Holbeck, who allowed me to accompany him in July, told me I would thoroughly enjoy going to serve there, especially because I speak Spanish as a second language. The Lord finally made a way for me to go to a town called Guaimaca in Honduras to this orphanage on July 11, 2013. It was a way made out of no way for one reason in particular. I say this because I am a parolee. I am not allowed to leave the state of Georgia without permission, much less the country. But God! He made the way!

The little kids called me by name or "tio," which means "uncle." Some of the older kids called me "pelón," or "baldhead." The children on the orphanage range from brand new to 18. All are not "orphans" by definition, as there are some who were unwanted by their family, and still others who arrived there due to government interference because of parents who were deemed "unfit" because of finances or drug problems.

In Honduras (pronounced ON-DURE-AZ), there are not many good job opportunities. It is a third-world country in central America. A "good job" there will bring home about \$130.00 a month. Only the rich drive cars. The cities and towns that I saw were all built to cater to the average pedestrian. The buildings are usually close together and there are fruit stands every 100 meters it seemed like. The danger is there as well, however. Honduras has the highest per capita murder rate in the world. Even tiny grocery stores have armed guards standing at the doors. No one in Honduras calls the police on a thief it seems. They are simply shot. This is where Orphanage Emmanuel and other compounds like it come in. They provide a place for hungry and abandoned children who could be legally killed for their next meal.



There are about 600 children being raised in a environment on Emmanuel. They are fed godly three times a day, given lodging, and an education. The orphanage is somewhat like a small city with church, dentist, clinic, and farm all in tow. It is because of this large task of caring for about 600 kids and maintaining a small city that Emmanuel is in constant need of volunteers. God continues to provide to meet needs when no one knows how because of the faith of David and Lydia Martinez who sold all their possessions upon hearing from God, and in 1989 bought the land to birth Emmanuel. (Dios con nosotros. God




with us.) More can be read about their testimony and contact information at www.orphanageemmanuel.com.

My time spent in Guaimaca at the orphanage was an experience that I will always remember. It is my desire to return when God gives me the green light. I was only there for two weeks this time, so I hope to stay longer next time. 



After graduating from Alabama State University, she began a teaching career in the field of Elementary Education in Georgia. The motivation to write children's books happened midstream of her teaching career. As her children were growing up, to relax, Marie would take some "me-time". During this time of leisure, sometimes, she would draw, exercise, write poems and/or jot down thoughts that developed into several manuscripts.

"Duffy and Huffy's Surprising Adventure" was one of the manuscripts. Animals were written to exhibit human-like characteristics. However, as she expounded this manuscript, over a period of three years, she produced a fantasy book with a moral ending. Two brown bears experienced a thrilling and chilling expedition through a dark and frightening forest in search of hidden treasures. But, a severe storm occurred, and the bears find themselves in the midst of a terrifying situation. Then, they discovered a little mountain lion. Thus, the plot changed.

"Duffy and Huffy's Surprising Adventure" was written for young children, ages 6-9 years old. In the classroom, this book would be an excellent story to read during guided and shared reading or for silent reading time. **Conch Salad**

medium tomatoes
small onion
