Don't Sweat It! SWOT It!!!

I read something recently that said, "Don't sweat the small stuff. And it's all small stuff." The author of this phrase was basically conveying there is no need to worry about anything or overreact when facing challenging situations. Although God's Word tells us not to worry (Phil. 4:6) many saints still do. We can either worry about things or work a solution to turn situations around to the glory of Almighty God!

One thing that can help us overcome our obstacles and make progress in our lives is a SWOT Analysis. SWOT stands for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats. Union Grove leaders sort of do a SWOT Analysis each year as they construct the annual strategic plans for their respective ministries. As our church journevs through the book of Exodus on Wednesdays, a SWOT Analysis could serve as an excellent tool to help us make improvements in our ministry teams and in our lives as well.

What follows are some questions I encourage you to answer in order to develop a strategy for improvement. Some of the questions are for our individual lives. Others are more geared toward ministries within the church. If there is anything you want to see improve or need turned around, then don't sweat it, SWOT it!

Strengths

What do other people say you do well?

How can you leverage your strengths to overcome challenges you're currently facing?

How are you using your strengths in ministry?

Are you able to operate in your strengths in your workplace?

Do your strengths influence healthy relationships for you?

Weaknesses

Is your ministry team relying on one person too much?

What can be improved?

Are your weaknesses hindering healthy relationships in your life?

Opportunities

- Is there an unmet need in our church and/or community your team can meet right now?
- What current trends impact your ministry?
- What opportunities can you create for you to move toward what you believe God has in store



Threats

- What are the three most significant challenges you're facing right now?
- What is the devil trying to steal, kill, or destroy in your life right now?
- What would happen if you did nothing at all to make things better?

Now, What?

After answering questions such as the ones provided there is the need to develop a strategy for improvement. Create and write down some goals that reflect the answers to the SWOT questions. Articulate action steps that will move you and/or your ministry team toward reaching the goals. Share your goals and action steps with others who will hold vou accountable. Trust God to bring you to a better place for His glory. Be encouraged. Don't sweat the small stuff. SWOT your way to bigger and better things as the Lord gives you strength. And, as I always say, "Enjoy the journey!"

Pastor Camile Holmes is a native of Warner Robins, Georgia and a graduate of Warner Robins High School. He is a graduate of Valdosta State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice. He is in the process of pursuing a Masters of Divinity Degree from the Andersonville Theological Seminary. He is married to his college sweetheart Mrs. Melvia Crane-Holmes and The Lord has blessed them with 5 children: Jamile, Kaylah, Cameron, Jaylen, and Jordan.

Growing up, he attended Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church of Warner Robins, Georgia where he served as a Junior Deacon, Youth and Young Adult Choir Musician, Soloist, and Tenor Section Leader. While in high school, he won 1st Place in the 1988 4-AAAA Georgia



High School Association Region and State Literary Male Solo Competition and he was a lead soloist in the 1988 Georgia High School All State Chorus. He was also a guest soloist in the 1987 Miss Black Georgia Pageant. In 2006, he was a guest Artist/Soloist at the Bobby Jones International Gospel Industry Retreat held in Hollywood, Florida. While attending Valdosta State University, he served on the Campus Activity Board, Resident Assistant of Brown Hall, Director and Musician of the Valdosta State University Gospel Ensemble, Tenor Section Leader and Soloist of the Valdosta State University Gospel Choir, worked at Magic 95 WGOV Radio Station, served as the VSU Mascot "Blaze", and became a member of the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

Pastor Holmes answered his calling to preach on October 22, 1995. When his assignment was complete at Pleasant View, God sent him to Macedonia Baptist Church of Villa Rica, Georgia in November of 2009. Under the leadership and direction of God, Pastor Holmes lead the church in reorganizing the Youth Department, the Music Ministry, the Trustee Ministry, the Dance Ministry, adding a Mime Ministry, building a New Sound Room, and substantial membership growth. When his assignment was complete at Macedonia, God sent him to Tremont Temple Missionary Baptist Church and Power Center of Macon, Georgia in August of 2013 where he is currently serving as Senior Pastor. Pastor Holmes and his family are excited about what God is doing at Tremont Temple. Even though great things are happening at Tremont Temple, Pastor Holmes knows that greater things are coming.

Pastor Grice retired as a Chief Master Sergeant from the United States Air Force after 30 years and 1 day of faithful service to his country. He graduated high school from Mobile County Training School in Plateau, Alabama. He graduated from the University of Nebraska at Omaha with a Bachelors' Degree in Psychology and is a graduate of Liberty Theological Seminary earning a Masters' degree in Religion. He recently graduated from Louisiana Baptist University and Seminary with a Ph.D. in Biblical Studies.

Pastor Grice accepted the call into the gospel ministry and was licensed and ordained as a minister at Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church, Warner Robins, Ga. After retiring from the U.S. Air Force in 1994, he began a Christian Fellowship in his home, which later became the True Vine Baptist Church.

Homecoming is a celebration that is rooted in black faith, history, thanksgiving and culture. It is a service in which families, friends and former church members flock from everywhere. It is also known by many in the African-American culture as "Big Meeting" Sunday.

My memories vividly recall these times in Union Grove: it was held on the 1st

Sunday in August, the Saturday prior would be a day of cleaning the grounds and church, it would include the young and old; it was a time when out of state members and relatives would travel back "home" from far and near. The songs were 0f promise, hope and survival. They were songs for the heart and soul. This was a day when everybody put their best foot forward. The service always ends with a congregational meal that was of traditional African-American food.

HOMECOMING, for all African-Americans is a fixed concept. It is a concept where we have to go back to the old landmark, to that fixed place and commune together...a time to recall how far we have come.



I joined Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church at an early age. I remember the bell ringing for funerals as well as for Sunday School, church and grade school. You could hear the bell ringing all over the community. If you heard the ringing and wasn't in church, you were late for whatever event was going on.

I worked on the Missionary Board, usher Board, Health Care Ministry and the Golden Achievers Ministry. It has been a blessing and a pleasure to work here at UGMBC these many years.

I joined Union Grove at an early age and was baptized in the outside pool. I am a life living member.

Union Grove served as a temporary school from 1942 - 1949. Approximately 75 students attended there while Pearl Stephens School was under construction. Carrie Bell Anderson and Cora Wilson served as teachers.

We gathered around a pot belly stove for prayers, pledges and lesson - Reading, Writing and Arithmetic and songs, etc.

"Pay of the Last Day" written and directed by Maggie Rutledge and The Family (played here) by the youth and various members and various school children from various areas - Jody Town, Baygall, Union Grove. Herbert Stephens played the Devil. The bell

was ringing and you could hear the bell.

"BIG MEETING" (HOMECOMING)

First Sunday in August

It was a little wooden church that sat on the red muddy hill with a pot belly stove. There were two outhouses, one on the right for women and one on the left side for men. On the right side of the church, there was a large oak tree. Homemade lemonade was made and served. Food (fried chicken, collard greens, sweet potato pies, cornbread, potato salad, pound cakes, banana pudding, etc.) was served from the trunks of members' cars. This church was the Holy Ghost Headquarters. Love, prayers, friends and hymns were sung with praising and blessings. Aunt Della Jackson and all the members would come home on that day for the celebration.

Union Grove served as a temporary school from 1947 - 1949; approximately 75 students attended.

I am a faithful servant on the Health Care Ministry and Golden Achievers Ministry and served on the Usher Board during my early years.

This event is bringing joy, happiness and blessings.

LET'S GET OUR FINANCIAL HOUSE IN ORDER PART V

STEP 5 - (PRAY) - By now you should have a pretty good picture of your finances, made a few adjustments, and are ready to pay down debt. Remember Proverbs 22:7 - The rich rule over the poor and the borrower is servant to the lender.

There are a number of things you can do. (1) Work some overtime or get a part-time job and use the money for extra debt payments only; (2) Have a yard sale to kick off your debt freedom with the proceeds. (3) Consolidate all of your credit cards onto the one with the lowest interest rate (no more charging) (close all store cards and any duplicate major cards) Keep the major card you have had the longest; (4) consolidate your payments into one via a home refinance or home equity loan; or (5) use the debt snowball (Dave Ramsey) or Debt stacking (Primerica) method. These are the same, just using different names.

If you paid off your gas card with the yard sale proceeds or with your check from your overtime, you are that much further ahead. But if you can't make any extra money, do the following:

Once you pay the Gas card off, add the \$75.00 to the \$65.00 for Mastercard. Now your Mastercard payment is \$140.00. All other payments remain the same. You have not increased the amount of debt payments going out each month. Once the Mastercard is paid out, your Visa payment becomes \$325.00 (\$140.00 + \$185.00). Just keep rolling the payments down until you are paying \$1,758.00 for your house payment. You will be surprised how quickly you get out of debt.

Any raises, bonuses, awards you receive can be added to help pay down debt as well. Just consider this. If you shave just 5 years off your mortgage: \$750.00 X 12 = \$9,000.00 X 5 years is \$45,000.00 in your pocket. What could you do with that? What could God do with that?


