I Am Legend & the Belt of Truth!

I was watching Will Smith's, *I* Am Legend the other day. This movie is about a virus designed to cure cancer, but ended up destroying 90% of all mankind. Out of the 10% who survived the epidemic, most of them turned into beasts referred to as "Darkseekers" who fed on the very few who were immune to the virus. Will Smith played LtCol Robert Neville who, as far as he knew, was the only remaining uninfected survivor. He remained vigilant by staying in the light; he went out only during the

day and ensured sunshine made its way into his home in daylight hours.

Neville spent most of his days collecting survival supplies, hunting deer, and broadcasting on a radio station calling for any other uninfected survivors to hook up with him. He would say to any proposed listeners, "You're not alone." He also frequently rented CDs from a store where he set up mannequins to pose as patrons and a cashier. He actually carried on conversations with them. The loneliness got to him after while. He even broke down and repeatedly begged one of them to talk back to him after his German Shepherd, Sam, died. I don't think we can blame him after we consider he had already lost his wife and daughter in a helicopter crash as they were evacuating the city. I suppose we'd all reach a breaking point at some point.

The Darkseekers would've destroyed Neville had it not been for another uninfected survivor and her son. They knew about him because of his broadcasts and came to his rescue. Anna told him



the Lord told her about a survivors' camp in Vermont. Neville had had enough. After all he had seen he was thoroughly convinced there was no God and argued his point with Anna very, very aggressively. Too bad he didn't live long enough to see it. If he had survived another onslaught of the Darkseekers, he probably would've lived to see the camp for himself as Anna and her son did at the movie's end.

The truth is the virus of the devil's lies has been destroying populations for generations. Those of us who are surviving his attacks must continue to fight daily against darkseekers. Our darkseekers are not flesh and blood, but real spiritual beings aggressively advancing Satan's agenda (Eph. 6:12). God's Word tells us to defeat them with the belt of truth. When the Apostle Paul mentioned having our loins girt about with truth (Eph. 6:14), he was saying the truth, like a belt, is to be worn tightly. Just as belts restrain, the truth of God is to do the same by holding us tightly to God's promises even when it looks impossible for Him to fulfill them. Our God is mighty and He will prove Himself faithful in our battles with the forces of darkness. I Am Legend and the Belt of Truth should encourage us all to:

WOW! Ministry Workers Training



When the members of the various ministries of Union Grove attended the Ministry Worker's Training on April 28, 2012, it was as if they were at a pep rally. From the time Pastor Clarke posed the question if they were glad to be a part of Union Grove, the members were pumped to learn as much as possible in order to maximize the church.

Utilizing the book by Sam Chand, <u>Cracking Your Church's Culture: Seven Keys to Unleashing Vision and Inspiration</u>, Pastor Clarke introduced the group to the various cultures that may be found in many of the churches. Dr. Chand says, "Culture is not only what we do, but also why and how we do it."

The following explanations of the various cultures by Dr. Chand should give a glimpse into what might be happening in Union Grove as well as other churches.

Inspiring cultures are ones with clear direction and an atmosphere of trust and respect. The inspiring cultures have leaders that give clear directions and value the input of every person. Because the leaders aren't authoritarians, an atmosphere of trust and respect attracts the winners. Because creativity is expected and rewarded at times, top leaders retrain or replace ministry leaders who can't provide a positive work environment.

Accepting cultures have a positive atmosphere but some unresolved issues. This type of culture, as defined by Dr. Chand, has a few incompetent leaders who remain on the job even though they are incompetent. Because the leaders in this culture are supportive of each other's roles and goals, some difficult decisions are avoided instead of addressed. Mediocrity is not an option. Top leaders are searching for ministry leaders who are assertive about taking care of problems in the culture. Due to the lackadical leaders some new members placed in this group are inclined to become deeply disappointed.

The leadership team of the **stagnant culture** sees staff members as production units, not people. Because the leaders are tolerated, not trusted or respected, complaining becomes the pastime. Small problems become large problems as people feel compelled to defend their position as they hang on to their power. Although the top leaders may send the leaders in this culture to seminars, the leadership team is not willing to make changes. Anyone that joins this group, with the purpose to bring life to the organization, may after a while give up.

Discouraging cultures might have members who never forget. Unresolved problems might lead to having leaders who become more authoritarian and threatening. When looking for remedies, they are unwilling to blame "the man in the mirror." While trying to remedy the unresolved problems and unhealed wounds, they demand compliance and loyalty and blame incompetent or unmotivated people in the organization. This type of culture can lead to the worst culture: toxic culture.

The **toxic culture** has leaders with closed minds that accept no advice or ideas from anyone in or out of the group. Those who want to leave are considered disloyal or uncreative. No communication is evident, for it is considered that suspicious ethical, financial, or sexual problems within the group are ignored. Quite often, leaders don't sense the toxicity, but it poisons their relationships and derails their vision.

<u>Cracking Your Church's Culture: Seven Keys to Unleashing Vision and Inspiration</u> would be a helpful resource for any church leader or pastor seeking a practical guide to bring about change at the leadership level. Pastor Clarke did an excellent job in introducing those in attendance to the dynamics found in many churches, as well as revealing what it takes to put in place a more positive church culture in the Growve Zone.

Deacon's Corner

A Testimony by Deacon Robert Simmons



Let me first start with defining the word "truth." Simply put, truth is any Word that proceeds out of the mouth of God. If you know and believe in the Word of God, you know and have truth. With that being said, let me start this testimony with two truths that allowed me to have victory with the war raging between the powers and how I used my belt of truth to overcome.

Truth 1: Revelations 3:7 says"...He who opens and no one shuts, and shuts and no one opens."

Truth 2: God is the provider of all our needs.

It was these two truths that allowed me to stand strong without being moved.

In 2007, I was working for a base contractor who was running out of contracts for me to work on. For months, my job hung in the balance. Being that I was proactive in looking for a job, an opportunity opened up with a government contractor company. I applied for the job and the waiting game began.

For the next six months, I went through a battle of faith, patience, trust, and truth. The job I applied for was my ideal job. It was with a major contracting company, I would be able to work with tools I was eagerly learning in graduate school, and I would receive valuable experience. There was even a strong possibility of a sizable pay increase. For months, I prayed, fasted and continually read my Word diligently.

The interesting thing about this situation was since I had truth, which guided and increased my faith, I refused to look for another job. Knowing that there was a great possibility of not getting the job, I had to stand on truth. I constantly prayed for God to open doors no man can close and close doors no man can open. I was diligent in pursing the job until an interview finally came.

When I interviewed, I knew the job was mine! Not only did I have a solid resumé, but one of the persons interviewing me was a former co-worker in which I had a good relationship.

A couple of weeks after the interview, I didn't hear anything. I called, sent e-mails, but still nothing. The more time passed, the harder I had to pray and the more I had to hold on to truth. Deep down in my heart, I believed God told me I was going to get the job. I had even more truth to hold onto.

At the beginning of 2008, I lost my current job. Now I was unemployed but I held on to the truth I read in God's Word and the truth God placed in my heart. The weeks continued to go by and finally I got a call. The manager informed me that I didn't get the job due to lack of experience, but there was a job request that was sent to him that morning he thought I would be a good fit for. The manager seemed impressed with my diligence for the first job (which was the favor of God) and he made sure I had the first opportunity to apply for the one he recommended. He then limited other applicants from applying. A couple of weeks later, I found myself working in the second ideal job.

The interesting thing about trusting God and knowing His truth is I had to trust Him not for just a job, but for the right job. The second job was less money and fewer benefits then the first and even my previous job. But the person who did get the first job was laid off three years later due to a lack of contract funding. I'm still employed and going on four years. Not only do we have to trust in things we can see or know, but trust in God's truth in the things unseen and unknown and that comes by knowing and applying His truth.



Battle is the Lord's Bible Study Series: Belt of Truth

Men's Ministry: Experience at the Cedine Ministry Retreat




Greetings Union Grove,
