Making Disciples of All Nations

When Jesus said. Make disciples of all nations. He simply meant that disciples of Christ are to make more disciples of Christ. In other words, more Christians (Matt 28:16-20). The theme for September is Teaching. Disciples are students of Christ's Word and as they learn, they are expected to live what they learn, and to be committed to and imitating the Master who taught them (Matt 16:21-24, Luke 14:25-27, John 8:31). In Luke 19:47, the Word tells us that Jesus was teaching daily in the temple. As disciples of Christ, we follow the example that Christ left us, and His example was perfect (1 Pet 2:21-25). In Matt 11:28-30, Jesus invites us, Take my yoke upon you and learn from me. It is our responsibility as disciples to allow

ourselves to be taught.

The GTAH Staff interviewed Deacon Edward Jarvis on the subject of discipleship. Deacon Jarvis eagerly expressed his thoughts:

What does the scripture Luke 19:47 mean to you?

This scripture means that just as Jesus continued his teaching daily with threats made against him: we must be courageous as Christians and demonstrate our faith and trust God when He speaks. The Bible says *The Lord* is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me? (Heb 13:6).

What does it mean to be a disciple?

A disciple is a follower of a teacher and their teachings so I decided to be a follower of Jesus. I believe in His Word that says, *I am the way, the*

truth and the life. No one comes to the Father, except through me (John 14:6).

What happens when men and women choose to become disciples?

When men and women disciples, become repentance should have taken place and they must be willing to adhere to the teacher's faith. The disciple of this day must iust as Jesus commanded them to do after He had given them power and authority over a11 dominion. He sends them out to preach kingdom of God and minister to the ill-fated. Luke 9:1-2 says disciples should be spreading the gospel.



Disciples can expect resistance. Jesus said in John 15:18,20, *If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you.*


Remember the word that I said to you. 'A servant is not greater than his Master.' If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you.

Union Grove Celebrates 124 Years!



In 1887, God inspired a group of God-fearing, Bible-believing Christians to gather under the shady branches of a bush harbor tree (located on a tract of land adjacent to Highway 247, approximately one block north of Green Street) to praise and worship, thus establishing the Union Grove Baptist Church. These spirit-filled members gathered to give thanks and to praise God for their many blessings. This assembly sparked the onset of Union Grove as a place of worship in a small farming town called Wellston, now known as Warner Robins, GA. As the membership grew, the space under the bush harbor was inadequate to meet the needs of the congregation. To accommodate this need, in 1887, R.W. and J.W. Johnson granted land to Union Grove for public worship. A dium-framed building was constructed on this land and it was during this period that Union Grove became a well established church in this small farming community.





The church was physically relocated from across highway 247 by the late Deacon Marvin Colbert with the assistance of others, using a mule and wagon when Robins Air Force Base (which was under construction) saw a need for this tract of land in 1940. Several church members searched for a new site and purchased land at the present location of the church, 809 South Davis Drive, from Sherman Reid for \$50.00.

The ground breaking ceremony for the renovation of the church and construction of the current sanctuary was held on August 13, 1994. The dedication service was held on October 15, 1995. Over 124 years, the membership has grown from a few gathered under the bush harbor to over 600 members. On December 15, 2002, Pastor David Anthony Clarke, Sr. was installed as the nineteenth pastor of Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church.

We will celebrate the church's 124th Anniversary the entire month of September with Pastor Lorenzo Heard on September 11, Minister Travis Greene on September 18 and Pastor Darrow Perkins on September 25.

Ministry Highlight: GTAH Ministry

Mission Statement: To aid others in spreading the knowledge of Christ and encouraging spiritual living through printed words



The GTAH Newsletter Ministry seeks to capture the great things that are happening at the Grove Zone. Members of the ministry spend a great deal of time interviewing and communicating with the Union Grove family and it's ministries to obtain information about their news and events. The ministry works collectively to creatively gather information, capture significant moments through snapshots, depicting events through heartening words, and finally perform a compilation of all the retrieved information for articles to be published to reach the hearts and minds of the church community.

Sister Jairee Williams, who has been a member of Union Grove since November 2008, is the ministry leader that desires to accomplish the four actions that Pastor Clarke requests for all the members of the church body and that is allowing the Holy Spirit to lead them in learning, serving, giving, and connecting.

The GTAH staff unites on the first Thursday of each month in various locations. The meetings consist of prayer, a Bible study on the monthly theme, discussion on the previous month's newsletter on feedback that was received and any improvements that need to be done. New assignment of roles and responsibilities for the upcoming newsletter are given at this time and the meeting is closed with fellowship and prayer.

The delivery of the bible studies allow the opportunity for spiritual growth on the subject matter to be applied through prayer and acted upon in the members' own personal lives. "The Bible studies are an integral asset for the ministry because we can enhance our understanding with what the Bible says on certain topics, share testimonies, welcome spiritual guidance, and then allow the Holy Spirit to aid us with expressing what we have learned and hope to spread that knowledge to the community," Sis. Williams explains.

The ministry has set goals and work diligently to accomplish these goals consistently. These goals are: (1) Spiritual Growth, (2) Ministry Growth, (3) Increasing ministry involvement (ministries promoting their events or sharing the great things that are happening through recurring articles), (4) Prioritizing deadlines, and (5) Promoting and publishing the GTAH through social networking.

Sis. Williams expressed, "As the team celebrates its first anniversary together this month, I often find myself reflecting on the past year and looking at the very first issue that we printed, September 2010. I compared it to our most recent issue, September 2011, and I can't stop praising the Lord for His manifestation that Great Things are Happening with the GTAH Ministry! We are blessed beyond measure, and the Lord worked to build a team full of loving and dedicated servants that make it exciting to serve Him from month to month. We have connected with each other, the church body, and with the community in more ways imaginable. That is reason to celebrate!"

For the remaining months in 2011, the themes and scripture references are:

- *October <u>Harvesting the Fruit</u> He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him (Ps 126:6)

Quarterly Ministry Workshop

The Quarterly Ministry Worker Training Session was held on Saturday, August 6, to discuss 1) Executing a Strategic Plan with Momentum and 2) Extraordinary Excellence. Now that strategic plans, goals and action steps have been developed, what will empower us to execute and make the plans materialize is momentum.





According to Pastor Clarke, we can create and sustain momentum through:

- Vision what drives you
- Prayer allows us to keep on going
- Focus on what you are moving toward rather than what you are leaving behind
- Prioritization set priorities so that everything won't become a priority, assign roles for the goals and have fun!
- Persistence helps us overcome the execution barriers that block momentum
- Celebration celebrate the wins…even the small ones.
- Motivation is necessary because over time, people's excitement and enthusiasm begin to wane.
- Dedication to Excellence the result of high intentions, sincere effort, intelligent direction, skillful execution and the vision to see obstacles as opportunities
- Communication the lack of communication opens the door to assumptions
- Godly use of Authority correct, restructure and hold people accountable.





He asks that we do all we can to create and sustain momentum. John Maxwell (in the 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership) says, "When leadership is strong and there is momentum in an organization, people are motivated and inspired to perform at higher levels."



Five keys to *Fleau*ing in Extraordinary Excellence are:

- Extraordinary Faith when what "could be" and "should be" become "what is"
- Extraordinary Love is demonstrated in extraordinary discipline, forgiveness, generosity, helpfulness and patience.
- Extraordinary Expectations high and specific
- Extraordinary Adoration we must adore Christ enough to learn, serve, give and connect as the Lord expects.
- Extraordinary Unity united in heart and mind

Five practical areas to demonstrate extraordinary excellence in the *Growve* Zone are: 1) Décor, 2) Evangelism, 3) Public Relations, 4) Preparation, 5) and Submission.

Dance Orientation




What does the Bible say about Teaching? Deuteronomy 6:1-25 (NIV) says...

- 1. These are the commands, decrees and laws the LORD your God directed me to teach you to observe in the land that you are crossing the Jordan to possess,
- 2. so that you, your children and their children after them may fear the LORD your God as long as you live by keeping all his decrees and commands that I give you, and so that you may enjoy long life.
- 3. Hear, O Israel, and be careful to obey so that it may go well with you and that you may increase
- greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, just as the LORD, the God of your fathers, promised you.
- 4. Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.
- 5. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your strength.
- 6. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts.
- 7. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.
- 8. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads.
- 9. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates.
- 10. When the LORD your God brings you into the land he swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to give you—a land with large, flourishing cities you did not build,
- 11. houses filled with all kinds of good things you did not provide, wells you did not dig, and vine-yards and olive groves you did not plant—then when you eat and are satisfied.
- 12. be careful that you do not forget the LORD, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery

- .13. Fear the LORD your God, serve him only and take your oaths in his name.
- 14. Do not follow other gods, the gods of the peoples around you;
- 15. for the LORD your God, who is among you, is a jealous God and his anger will burn against you, and he will destroy you from the face of the land.
 16. Do not test the LORD your God as you did at Massah.
- 17. Be sure to keep the commands of the LORD your God and the stipulations and decrees he has

given you.

- 18. Do what is right and good in the LORD's sight, so that it may go well with you and you may go in and take over the good land that the LORD promised on oath to your forefathers,
- 19. thrusting out all your enemies before you, as the LORD said.
- 20. In the future, when your son asks you, "What is the meaning of the stipulations, decrees and laws the LORD our God has commanded you?"
- 21. tell him: "We were slaves of Pharaoh in Egypt, but the LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand.
- 22. Before our eyes the LORD sent miraculous signs and wonders—great and terrible—upon Egypt and Pharaoh and his whole household. 23. But he brought us out from there to bring us in and give us the land that he promised on oath to our forefathers.
- 24. The LORD commanded us to obey all these decrees and to fear the LORD our God, so that we might always prosper and be kept alive, as is the case today.
- 25. And if we are careful to obey all this law before the LORD our God, as he has commanded us, that will be our righteousness.


Sunday School Promotion Celebration

dancing.






