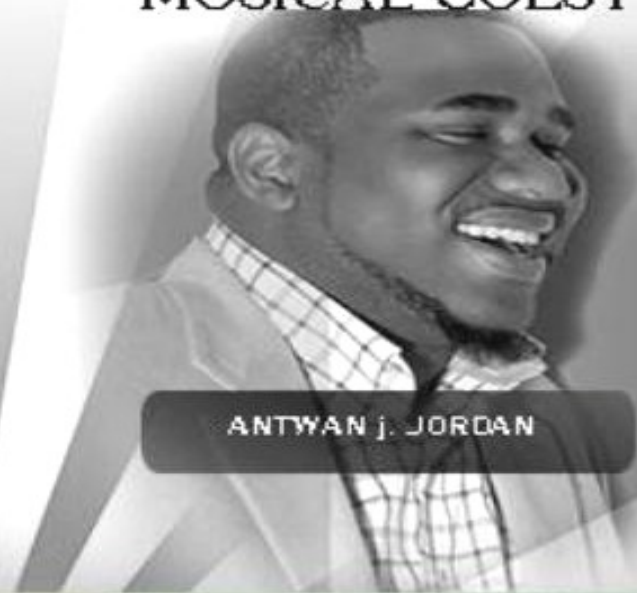

GSWAG Concert

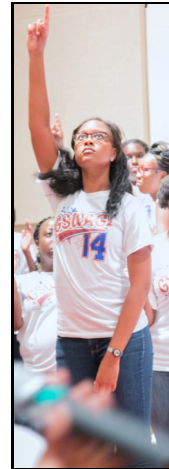

THANK YOU!

On behalf of the Homecoming Committee, I want to thank you – Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church – for helping to make our 127th Church Homecoming, August 3, 2014, a tremendous success. A summary of those who completed the UGMBC: HOMECOMING 2014 EVALUATION thought Homecoming was a success.

99% thought the homecoming experience and the schedule of activities was good to excellent;

98% thought the schedule was good to excellent;

98% thought the worship service experience was excellent and 4% thought it was good;

93% thought the dining/fellowship experience was good to excellent;

100% would like to have homecoming again;

Whether homecoming should be a two day affair, 42% said yes and 52% said no; and,

Whether homecoming should be at the same time as the anniversary, 49% said yes and 51% said no.

Before the event could take place there had to be an approved written strategic plan, with goals and action steps. The Strategic Plan to Expand Homecoming for 2014 was submitted by the Golden Achievers to the Spiritual Enrichment Ministry (SEM) for approval. The plan included four major components – background, goals, answer the question why have the activity and action steps.

The BACKGROUND provided a definition of homecoming in general, a specific definition of church homecoming and suggested homecoming scriptures.

The GOALS included anticipated new joins, attendance numbers and the sources for the attendees, i.e. membership, former members, neighbors and friends and special guests.

The answering of the question of WHY have the event was addressed as: to expand the Homecoming Sunday event to include a meet and greet event after services at the Vision Center, where members can get to know each other in an informal social environment; neighbors get to mingle and know many of their other members of the community; for others to know what goes on in the large building (the church) in the community and hopefully become members; and out-of-area friends, family and former members gather to celebrate the achievements of the present, commemorate the past and anticipate the blessings of the future.

The ACTION STEPS included crucial timeframe elements of key events, beginning with the receipt to go forward from SEM, selection of a committee, followed by periodic sequence of meetings until the date of event and followed by a wrap-up meeting after the event of what I refer to as a “soft evaluation.”

THE DAY began on Sunday, August 3, 2014, with prayer services at 7:45 a.m., followed by the powerful message at 8:00 a.m. services by Pastor Camile Holmes, Tremont Temple Missionary Baptist Church, Macon, Georgia, *“How to Take Back What the Enemy Have Stolen,”* from 1 Samuel 30:6-8, with 296 in attendance; 9:30 a.m. Sunday School, with the topic of *“Consolation Through Prayer”*, II Corinthians 1:3-11; the 11:00 a.m. services included a historical dramatization by Sister Sharon Broughton playing the role of an elderly mother of the church, including brief parts by Sister Abrams, Deacons Laney and Stephens, and Brother James; then Senior Pastor, Dr. Jesse L. Grice, True Vine Baptist Church, San Antonio, Texas provided us with a dynamic sermon on faith, *“If You Want to Walk on Water, You Got to Get Out of the Boat,”* Matthew 14:22-33, with 443 in attendance.

We - with our guests, former members and friends, entered the immaculate Vision Center, beginning around 12:45 p.m. to sooth our stomachs on a menu of three kinds of salads – garden, potato, and fruit; vegetables of collard greens, field peas, butter beans, squash with onions, rutabagas, macaroni and cheese, yellow rice, and bean soup; and desserts galore with such cakes as key lime, coconut, chocolate, caramel, carrot and pound – such pies as sweet potato, lemon, coconut, pecan, banana pudding, and peach cobbler; and breads included corn bread muffins, regular corn bread, and rolls; and meats – a plenty – pork ribs, ham and chicken; and washed down with water, tea, and homemade lemonade. WHAT A FEAST!

The day ran smoothly, visitors stayed for extended periods of time and seemed to enjoy themselves, evaluations from the committee and many members had many good comments, and overall the day was a success. Homecoming is a huge event and it wouldn't be possible without the assistance of countless people who help prepare ahead of time, work during the event itself, and clean up afterwards. It truly is a corporate church event from the committee planning it to the people working it. Thank you for helping to make the day possible!

I heard many great things from visitors and members. During the day many people came up to me to compliment us on how smoothly the event ran or how successful it seemed. Wrap-up comments from the committee also included suggestions and positive comments.

The Homecoming event was just a microcosm of what Union Grove Missionary Baptist Church can do as we continue to uplift God as our theme indicates, from Psalm 150, *“Remembering Our Past and Creating Our Future.”*

Rate the event: Excellent - 45, Good - 9, Fair, Unsatisfactory - 1

Comments: 1) All the events were wonderful. 2) Very good! 3) Don't change it. 4) I felt the Holy Spirit. 5) Everything just flowed perfectly. 6) The worship and preaching was excellent. 7) Parking for the overflow should have been on the grass lot, with shuttle bus service from there. 8) I spent all day at church.

Rate the event: Excellent - 50, Good - 4, Fair, Unsatisfactory

It was so good to see all our family fellowship with each other. 2) This was the best homecoming service and dinner I have had at Union Grove. 3) The wait was longer for drinks than for food. 4) The lemonade gave out too quickly. 5) I enjoyed fellowship with many former members. 6) I really enjoyed helping to serve. 7) The dining experience was great! 8) Consider purchasing additional stoves. 9) The next time have the food prepared by outside service so all members can fully participate in all events. 10) Everything was so good; but, we always have complaints. 11) The way some of the food was obtained was confusing. 12) I did not attend the dining and fellowship at the Vision Center; but I heard it was awesome. 13) Homecoming was well organized; and, we had plenty of food. 14) The food handlers could be more forthcoming and not put the food back early. 15) I prefer dinners be shuttled to and from the Vision Center to avoid parking problem. 16) Although I rated the dining/fellowship experience good, we need to make some improvement in the food service.

It is too much to do every year. 5) Golden Achievers are awesome – great job. 6) Homecoming has been a very important part of our church history. 7) Homecoming is supposed to be an annual event on the church calendar.

Would you like homecoming to be a two day affair (Saturday & Sunday)? Yes - 15, No - 21

If you answered yes, what would be the attraction for Saturday?

Worship services both days - 4, Attraction draw (for Saturday) - 17 – concert/singing (gospel), theatrical performance (gospel play) -1 other - 5

Comments: 1) On Saturday, we should have a picnic at the park for family and friends. 2) On Saturday, we could meet and connect with each other. 3) The worship service should always be on Sunday, followed by dinner. 4) Have a picnic with food and fellowship, and games on Saturday. 5) We could have a concert as the attraction for Saturday.

Would you like homecoming to be at the same time as the anniversary? Yes - 27, No - 28

Other Comments: 1) The celebration of one day for homecoming would be best. 2) The homecoming event should always be an individual service event. 3) It would be nice to try the two together to see how it would work out. 4) I would like to see these events to continue to be done separately. 5) Keep the two events separate because of Pastor Clarke's installations on anniversaries. 6) The two events should be separate. Otherwise, there would be too much to do at one time. 7) Funds and time could be more useful if held at the same time. 8) The two events are too close to each-other. 9) Brother James and committee, you guys "Rock." 10) When I get to that golden age, I will join the Golden Achievers. 11) Thank you all! Get action reports to make improvement. Set aside funds to cover the event. 12) Collect funds early from every member to cover the total cost. 13) Make sure the total worship experience is videoed. 14) It was great to come together and celebrate our Lord and love for each other in fellowship. 15) Homecoming and church anniversary should continue to be separate events. 16) Begin the fundraiser a year ahead of the event in order to encourage all members to participate, not just the ministries (where some do not participate). 17) The event needs to be sponsored by more than the Golden Achievers. 18) It would be nice to have the entire event recorded on DVD for-sale as a memorabilia and as a fundraising means to help defray the cost of the event.
